In his book, Adorning the Dark, @andrewpetersonmusic gives ten tips to songwriting that magically apply to almost all creative endeavors.

One of his tips is: Don't obsess over the perfect rhyme.

He says some songs end up better because they don't rhyme. But it's the job of the writer to make sure if they are sacrificing rhyme, that the end result makes a better song as a whole.

He ends with these words: "You have to earn the right to break the rules".

When I was in elementary school I dreaded fridays. Everyone around me rejoiced about TGIF, but not me, because it was the day of the spelling test.

I wasn't good at spelling. I'm still not. The problem was, I believed the purpose of the test was to find out what I already knew, not to encourage me to learn. At first I didn't realize that we were allowed, much less encouraged to study the spelling words! Wasn't that like cheating?! You either knew the words or you didn't. I didn't.

Over the years some kind teachers taught me that the whole purpose of the test was to give us motivation to learn how to spell new words. Learning could even be fun. There were little sayings and rhymes like, "I before E except after C" that helped. I learned that none of my friends were born knowing how to spell words. They learned over time, too.

Of course, it's the same with lots of skills. Even decorating.
